December 2023

Dear Friends of PRC,

"The Word became flesh and and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." John 1:14

This year has been full of God's glory and representations of his Abundant Life:

- Two mothers have chosen adoption for their babies (the most we have had make this decision in any given year!)
- So far, 42 babies have been born to our client familes this year!
- A \$20,000 gift was provided to purchase EveryLife Diapers for both of our sites; our storehouses are full with anticipation of even more babies to be born in the coming year!
- Our new site in Lock Haven is nearly finished, with all the large construction projects almost ready for inspection and finer details to be completed in early 2024.
- Spiritual conversations, Gospel presentations, and/or prayer have been shared with over 300 people.
- We were blessed with two new ultrasound machines to serve our clients with excellent care one at each site. The one in State College was donated by the Heinz Family Foundation and the one in Lock Haven was donated by the Knights of Columbus Council #4678 of State College.

Each client story we have had the privilege to be part of is unique, and we were so blessed by the opportunity to see beautiful and redemptive stories unfold right before our eyes. The privilege to serve our community on your behalf is truly humbling. Thank you for supporting the mission of PRC in 2023.

- I anticipate hiring at least 3 new staff members for our Lock Haven site. We currently have \$7,300 per month coming in from Clinton County supporters. We need at least \$25,000 monthly to cover operating and employee expenses.
- Our client load, operating expenses, and marketing needs have all increased. We are upgrading our website and signage and will be doing some rebranding this coming year.
- We have upgrades that need to be made to our 423 site in State College. The upstairs is currently under renovation and will need to be furnished, and the downstairs needs some upgrades, too.
- As we catapult into our 40th Year of serving our communities, will you join us with a one-time gift or monthly donation?

PASTOR'S NOTES

A Call to Radical Discipleship...

A young man in his 30's trying to find his way back to God, a married couple that proclaimed faith for 40 years walks away from Jesus, a history of young people who grew up in church that all but left Christianity after they graduated high school and stories of pastors renouncing their faith in Christ.

These are all true stories that have come across my life recently. It feels a bit like watching a life shattered by alcohol and drugs, only here in the realm of faith. Maybe you've seen some stories like this too.

What are we observing?

According to researchers who work with Barna and other outfits, we are in the midst of the greatest 'de-churching' in American history. The Tim Keller Center for Cultural Apologetics informs us that in recent years:

- there have been 40 million people who have stopped regularly attending church.
- 15 million of those are people who identify as evangelicals.

This shift is happening faster and is greater in size than the 1st and 2nd Great Awakening in American History and the Billy Graham Crusades combined. Though not all the news is bad news. God is at work, and we can continue to praise him.

In the last few years, one place God has been working is among Gen Z and Millennials. They are the largest growing group that is fully embracing a life of following Christ and digging deep into life in the body of Christ.

If what happened at Asbury last year and among other college campuses is any indication of what God may be doing in this generation of young people, studies among Gen Z are showing that once young people find Christ they are 'all-in' with a whole-hearted pursuit for him.

They are expressing a strong desire for serious discipleship, authenticity in church community, and a move away from the 'attractional' style of worship that was once largely embraced by modern evangelicals to a simpler style of worship that humbly pursues Jesus and feels real as opposed to all the previous years of lights and smoke.

This is what is showing up in the research. So what does it mean for us?

I would suggest that we take a look again at Jesus words in the gospel of Mark 8:34-35,

"Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and the gospel will save it."

How might we sum up what Jesus is saying to all who say they want to follow him?

Radical Discipleship

Jesus words are an all-in, never look back, fully devoted, heart committed life of following him in radical discipleship.

Here's what I think this means and doesn't mean. Let me start with the latter. I don't think Jesus was just calling us to 'DO MORE'. To be busier in our serving, to fiercely hold fast to and defend traditions of the church that make us feel comfortable, or to wake up each morning and just 'try harder' at being good.

I believe what Jesus meant was for us to see him for who he is and to fully surrender our hearts and lives to him in full obedience to all he said, believing that he is Lord and he fully loves us. This means we learn to 'day by day' walk in a relationship with Him.Trusting Him by faith. Obeying where he says to obey. Set our lives to seek first the kingdom of God and not the kingdom of this world.

I wonder, if much of the de-churching that is going on and people who are 'walking away' from Christ, is because people built their faith around traditions, or act of doing, but missed the heart of God. My heart breaks to see so many like sheep without a shepherd, living confused or disillusioned as to who Jesus is.

Jesus call in Mark 8, is not just a heartless staunch obedience, but to a joy-filled life of walking with the one who loves you the most. To often, it feels as if part of our struggle is that we try to grab on to part of Jesus, while also still trying to hold on to other parts of our life and 'save our life'. I wonder, if for many, Jesus is more like our relationship to our family physician. We know they know what's best for our health, but we just can't let go of our old habits. Maybe we follow some of their advice. When we are really sick, we need them right away, but when things seem more or less to be going along just fine, we are content to just do life our own way, with underlying issues that we are yet unwilling to address.

The older I get, spiritually speaking, it feels like there are more and more 'underlying issues' that so many people choose to live with, that keep them truly knowing Christ and following Him. The only way to truly know him and avoid a collapse of faith in our lives, is to follow his call to radical discipleship. We must, with faith, be all in with Jesus our Lord and our Savior. Like the song says, 'No turning back,'

How is Jesus calling you today to radical discipleship?

In your heart, will you decide that he is worthy and greater than everything else?

What will you do to know him and follow him?

How can we foster a community of radical discipleship at PFBC in 2024?

I encourage you to pray about these things. Pray so that your heart will hold fast to Christ and never be tempted to walk away. Pray so that your love for him will grow deeper. Your worship will be greater. Pray so that Jesus will be glorified in this world and the world will see him as he truly is, the way, the truth, and the life. And that includes you and me.
